In 2022, as our nation transitioned back to an in-person world semi-post-pandemic, Oliver Scholars continued its time-tested mission of identifying and supporting the brightest students in New York City and creating a clear pathway into the nation's most competitive colleges and universities. We hit the ground running reconnecting with our community, alumni, scholars, partner schools, families, and friends. We reconstituted in-person classes, workshops, reunions, our internship program, college tours, the CEO salon series, and events.

We doubled down on the relevance of our mission to nurture and educate Black and Latinx students who've been historically excluded from and underserved by most educational institutions and systems, expanding our admission and placement partnerships.

We took time to reevaluate our mission and offerings, broadening our brand to include new terminology that clearly articulates how we not only unlock opportunity for our youth but help them to Outdream, Outdo and Outshine through our pillars of Scholarship, Leadership, and Service. The new brand launch was just the beginning of a myriad of ideas we have cultivated to expand Oliver's capacity and critical work throughout the city, nation, and the world.

Our scholars' hard work paid off and led to \$9.9 million in scholarships and grant offers for the Class of 2022! Additionally, with the help of the Oliver Scholars community and generous supporters, we were able to raise a historic \$824K at our annual gala - a record for us.

As you peruse the pages of this annual report, you'll hear from our scholars and their families the profound impact on the lives of our scholars. When you uplift an Oliver Scholar, you don't just uplift an individual student. You are making an investment that has social and economic generational impact. You're not just changing that student's life; you're transforming the trajectory of their lives in ways that have allowed so many of our scholars to pay it forward.

From finance to government to television to medicine - our alumni are opening doors of opportunity for themselves and holding those doors open for the Black and Latinx scholars who will follow in their footsteps. We provide crucial support for both the scholars and their families so they can realize their full potential and ultimately give back to the city, the nation, and the world.

A SCHOLAR'S STORY: JAYLYNN CORTES

Jaylynn Cortes is a senior at the Nightingale-Bamford School in New York City. She joined the Oliver Scholars Program in 2017, gaining the necessary tools to become an active member in her community and a strong force in the classroom. She became proficient in critical reading, time management, and productive studying skills. During the 14-month program, the relationships she formed with both fellow students and staff was vital in helping her pursue her passions. At Nightingale, she is co-head of the Athletic Board, captain of the Varsity Basketball and Varsity Softball teams, member of the History Student Advisory Council, head of Tour Guides, and is a Freshman Peer Leader. Through her school's career readiness summer program, she interned at Atalaya Capital Management, a wealth management firm. After experiencing the tight-knit community at the Nightingale-Bamford School (populated with only 200 Upper Schoolers) she feels prepared to attend the bustling campus life of Yale University, where she will study Ethics, Politics, and Economics. She chose Yale for its emphasis on community building through residential colleges, as well as its liberal arts focus. Although she loves the city, she's excited for the change of environment and pace that college will offer. Jaylynn is immensely grateful for Oliver Scholars' guidance and support; the program has truly shaped who she is today and helped her realize her full potential.

SCHOLAR SUCCESS

The Third Annual Virtual College Admissions week was held in October, with 20 colleges and universities present and many scholars and families testifying how helpful this was to their college application journey. Despite any adversity our youth may face in the slow recovery from the pandemic, Oliver Scholars' has reported the highest rate of enrollments and acceptance into specialized and independent schools this year. SCHOLAR IMMERSION PROGRAM

Our scholars, having completed the 14-month placement program, participated in the first in-person summer school program since before pandemic restrictions were in place. With full academic course loads, test prep for high school admissions tests, performing arts, film, and art electives, scholars spent most of their weeks at Grace Church and one immersive boarding school week at The Berkshire School. We officially honored them at the annual Recognition Ceremony, where they transitioned into full-fledged Oliver Scholars, and will continue to dream bigger for the future.

His passion and dedication to wrestling has opened so many doors and given him many opportunities that he is so grateful for. During his time at Kiski, he has held the roles of Wrestling Captain, Culture Pot Vice President, Dorm Head RA, Prefect, and now is currently the Head Prefect. As he wraps up his senior year Sulayman shared how excited he is to come back home to New York City and to attend Columbia University. One of the primary reasons he chose Columbia was because of the opportunity to make history for New York City in New York City. All in all, Sulayman expresses his gratitude that all of this is possible because his parents believed in Oliver Scholars, which in turn made him believe.

COLLEGE BOUND INITIATIVES

Our goal for this year was to outdo last year's acceptance rates and increase college interest for our scholars. We hosted the first in-person College Tour for our Juniors since 2019, visiting eight colleges & universities in seven days and receiving college admissions advice from specialists and current college students. Our Alumni Council Scholar Support Committee members, Melvin Boone '10 and Johnny Araujo '09, developed the College Coach Program, designed to guide Oliver Scholars through the college experience by providing an alumni mentor; the program will officially launch in Fall 2023. Lastly, we hosted our annual Career Exposure Conference to provide insight into educational paths and careers in varying fields, ranging from law to STEM.

A SCHOLAR'S STORY: ANAKHU HERU GRENCH

Becoming an Oliver Scholar was one of the best decisions I could've made in my academic journey. When I first entered the program, I was challenged both academically and socially and came out with lifelong friendships. My family and I committed to commuting from the Bronx to Connecticut every day, making sacrifices to ensure I had the best educational opportunity. Entering high school I realized the program not only prepared me for the rigorous academics, but also for the challenges of social transition that comes with being a new student of color in a predominantly white institution. I didn't let these challenges stop me from exploring my passions and taking advantage of all of the opportunities that had been afforded to me as soon as I entered the space. Since beginning at Greenwich Academy I have been a Vice President of my school's Varsity Dance Company, President of the Hip Hop Dance Club and Diversity Outreach Project and Enrichment (D.O.P.E.) Club, run for student government every year since freshman year and was elected as Community Service Board Representative and Diversity Equity and Inclusion Board Representative. I have been a School Ambassador, a Peer leader, a member of Tyne Gospel Choir, and a Makeup Designer for my school's theater program, all this whilst taking Honors Courses and APs and maintaining Honor Roll and High Honor Roll all four years. Oliver was a constant support and had ingrained in us early on the importance of taking advantage of all of these opportunities and keeping Scholarship, Leadership, and Service at the core of it all.
