SCHOLAR SUCCESS


In 2023, Oliver Scholars remained steadfast in its commitment to offering comprehensive support and avenues for growth to high school students. This dedication fueled an expansion of the Scholar Services department's engagement initiatives, introducing innovative and impactful programs.

At the forefront was the Brand2Biz: Personal Branding & Business Basics Camp-a two-week immersive summer program. This initiative aimed to expose students to the dynamic world of business, emphasizing the cultivation of personal brands, networking skills, and financial literacy. Collaborations with influential organizations, including Small Girls PR, WNBA/NBA League, Wavemarker Global (WM Global), and Nordstrom, elevated the experience by providing valuable insights and connections.

The Scholar Services department also organized a thoughtprovoking social justice conference, "Forms of Resistance." This conference was designed to empower students to effectively resist systemic inequities and progress toward a more equitable and fulfilling future.

In 2023, Oliver Scholars continued to redefine educational experiences, ensuring students are not only academically empowered but also equipped with the skills and perspectives to thrive in a diverse and dynamic world.



SCHOLAR IMMERSION PROGRAM

Having completed the 14-month placement program, 54 scholars matriculated at high school in Fall 2023. With full academic course loads as well as electives including performing and visual arts, scholars spent five weeks at Grace Church High School in New York City and one immersive boarding week at Berkshire School in Sheffield, MA. We officially honored them at the annual Recognition Ceremony, where they transitioned into full-fledged Oliver Scholars, and will continue to dream bigger for the future.

My educational journey began during middle school at an environmentally-focused charter school in Queens. While I performed well in my classes, I felt a lack of academic challenge. Limited by resources, I spent my afternoons at home, completing homework and thinking about the opportunities that awaited me in high school. With very little knowledge about specialized high schools and independent schools, I looked around me for guidance. When I heard about scholarship programs during middle school, I initially failed to understand their importance. However, driven by the idea of new experiences and opportunities, I applied to Oliver. Upon entering the program, I faced academic challenges that pushed me to reconsider my place in the classroom.

Through the SIP program, Saturday Academy, and the virtual SIP 2 program, I prepared for the unique environment of independent schools. Despite the rigorous high school application process, I was fortunate to secure acceptance into my top choice, Dalton. At Dalton, I was initially taken aback by the shift in demographics, academic rigor, and conversational style. However, amidst the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, I found my place in the community through club involvement, events, and sports.

Over time, I took on leadership roles such as managing editor for the school newspaper, head of the Black Student Union, and senior member of the robotics team. During the summer, alongside other experiences like my TA duties at Oliver and various internships arranged by my counselor there, I developed a passion for learning and teaching throughout my high school journey.

With these experiences in, I applied to various colleges during my junior year, keeping my eyes on a select few throughout the process. As I delved into crafting my essays and personal statement, I reflected deeply on my journey from middle school to the present and envisioned my future path. After submitting my applications, I was overjoyed to receive an acceptance from Brown University. Along with my peers, I am eager to continue expanding my horizons as a learner, engineer, and individual both in and out of the classroom.

The Oliver Scholars College Bound Initiatives department orchestrated impactful events to empower high school scholars on their college journey. The Class of 2023 embarked on a weeklong College Tour in March, exploring 10 colleges and universities across five states. Oliver college scholars served as knowledgeable guides, offering insights into campus life.

During the Summer, the "High School Senior Seminar" prepared scholars for the challenges of their senior year and successful college applications. 

Most recently, Chymeka launched the entrepreneurship education nonprofit, BUILD NYC, having served as its Founding Regional Executive Director for nearly seven years establishing relationships with key stakeholders and setting the organization's strategic direction. Prior to BUILD, Chymeka served as the National Executive Director of Minds Matter National Inc., an academic mentoring nonprofit. During her tenure, Minds Matter doubled the number of students served and successfully launched four of its then 12 chapters. Óver the years, Chymeka has worked in programming, development, and management capacities at several nonprofits and government agencies including the New York City Department of Education (DOE) and at The After-School Corporation (TASC) now known as ExpandEd. At the DOE's Office of Strategic Partnerships, she oversaw a number of large efforts to bring private-sector philanthropy into public schools. While at TASC, Chymeka led an effort to advance the after-school workforce through the creation of credit-bearing certificate programs in partnership with the City University of New York. Earlier in her career, Chymeka also worked at New York Cares and Jumpstart for Young Children.
